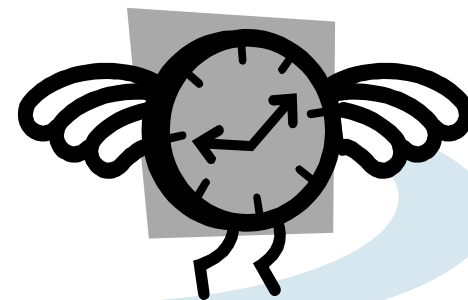

Time Travel Fiction

(FIC Bellairs, J.) *The ghost in the mirror* by John Bellairs. Rose Rita Pottinger and Mrs. Zimmerman are transported back to 1828 to save the Weiss family from being destroyed by a wicked wizard.

(FIC Boston, L.) *The children of Green Knowe* by L. M. Boston. Tolly comes to live with his great-grandmother at the ancient house of Green Knowe and becomes friends with 3 children who lived there in the 17th century.

(FIC Cooney) *Both sides of time* by Caroline B. Cooney. The summer after senior year, Annie, wishing she could have lived a hundred years ago in a more romantic time, finds herself in the 1890s and it is indeed romantic — and very painful. [also by Caroline Cooney — *For all time* and *Prisoner of time*]

(FIC Cooper) *King of shadows* by Susan Cooper. While in London as part of an all-boy acting company preparing to perform in a replica of the famous Globe Theatre, Nat Field suddenly finds himself transported back to 1599 and performing in the original theatre under the tutelage of Shakespeare himself.

(FIC Crichton) *Timeline* by Michael Crichton. A group of scientists, having learned how to travel through time, enter life in 14th century feudal France and threaten the history of the world.

(FIC Finney, J.) *Time and again* by Jack Finney. Illustrator Si Morley steps out of his 20th century New York apartment one night — right into the winter of 1882.

(FIC Hautman) *Mr. Was* by Pete Hautman. After his dying grandfather tries to strangle him, Jack Lund discovers a door that leads him 50 years into the past and involves him in events that determine his own future.

(FIC Lasky, K.) *Blood secret* by Kathryn Lasky. 14-year-old Jerry Luna, mute since her mother's disappearance, is sent to her great-great-aunt Constanza's house, where she discovers a trunk that draws her into the world of her ancestors during the Spanish Inquisition.

(FIC Levitin, S.) *The cure* by Sonia Levitin. A 16-year-old boy living in 2407 collides with the past when he finds himself in Strasbourg in 1348 confronting the anti-Semitism that sweeps through Europe during the Black Plague.

(FIC Peck, R.) *Voices after midnight* by Richard Peck. Living with their sister and parents in a rented house in New York City during the summer, Chad and Luke uncover a mystery involving the former tenants of the house when the two brothers slip back in time to 1888.

(FIC Whitmore) *Trapped between the lash and the gun* by Arvella Whitmore. 12-year-old Jordan is becoming dangerously involved with a street gang when he is suddenly transported through time to become a slave on the plantation of his ancestors.

(FIC Willis) *To say nothing of the dog, or, How we found the bishop's bird stump at last* by Connie Willis. Part time travel, part mystery, part comedy of errors, this clever fantasy has much to offer.

(FIC Yolen) *The devil's arithmetic* by Jane Yolen. Hannah resents the traditions of her Jewish heritage until time travel places her in the middle of a small Jewish village in Nazi-occupied Poland.
